ENCOURAGING ELDERS

Ask yourself this question. How important are the elders to a local congregation? Hopefully, your answer is, "very important!" God sure thought it was! Consider (Titus 1:4) "For this reason I left you in Crete, that you would appoint elders in every city as I directed you." It was God's plan for His church to in each city to be shepherded by elders. Paul told Titus that it should be according to the instruction he was given. Since being a shepherd is important, it was necessary to choose men who met the God's qualifications (I Tim.3, Titus 1).

Due to the fact that shepherding is such an important calling, there is a lot of pressure put on the elders to rule or manage well. Most elders are men who really do desire to do their best. We as members of the Lord's body must understand that although there is a high calling and code of conduct for elders, they are still human as we are.

We should expect our shepherds to not only meet the qualifications and continue in them, but we must be understanding so that we don't hold them to perfection...which no man can attain to.

The Bible is very clear that we must obey and submit to our leaders. We are also told to let them do their work with joy and not with grief. An elder or eldership that is covered in grief and discouragement will not shepherd well. As the scriptures say, it would not be profitable for us. Make sure that at least a few times a year you personally let them know how much they are appreciated.
